The results show a positive impact of remittance inflows on economic welfare. We find evidence to support that ease of doing business are complements with remittance inflows in determining economic welfare. We show that the minimum capital for business start-up increases economic welfare in the long run when conditioned on remittance inflows. The marginal effect shows that the positive long term impact of inclusive business is enhanced at higher levels of remittance inflows.
