Maria Rosa Menocal 2010-08-03 Arabic culture was a central and shaping phenomenon in medieval Europe, yet its influence on medieval literature has been ignored or marginalized for the last two centuries. In this ground-breaking book, now returned to print with a new afterword by the author, María Rosa Menocal argues that major modifications of the medieval canon and its literary history are necessary. La literatura secreta de los últimos musulmanes de España Luce López Baralt

2009 La posteridad está en deuda con los últimos musulmanes de España. Los moriscos del siglo XVI nos legaron la crónica minuciosa de sus últimos días sobre suelo español, y sus códices sirven de espejo aleccionador a muchas situaciones históricas contemporáneas. Desde la más estricta clandestinidad y a riesgo de sus propias vidas, los anónimos criptomusulmanes preservaron la noticia de su vida cotidiana, de sus ansiedades, de sus conflictos y de sus sueños en un corpus manuscrito tan híbrido como sus propias almas, ya que estaba escrito en

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castellano pero transcrito en la grafía árabe, para ellos sagrada por razones religiosas e identitarias. El presente estudio intenta resucitar ese mundo enterrado, y ofrece un muestrario representativo de los asuntos que más interesaron a la comunidad morisca: las prácticas rituales islámicas, la magia, la astrología, la medicina, las profecías, la interpretación de sueños, los itinerarios secretos que los podían guiar a huir de España y aun para volver sigilosamente, como Ricote, de regreso a su patria natural. Los antiguos folios nos ofrecen auténticas sorpresas: tenemos testimonios sobrecogidos sobre cómo los musulmanes sufrieron la caída de Granada y la persecución inquisitorial; una novela ejemplar a la italiana endeudada con Lope y con Quevedo pero imbuida con una moraleja islamizante; el extraño caso de un morisco maurófilo; talismanes para hacerse invisible, para protegerse de los genios y para la buena memoria; interpretaciones de la Celestina como texto disidente; instrucciones

pías sobre cómo hacer el amor recitando azoras coránicas y sonetos de Lope de Vega. Las letras aljamiado-moriscas cierran filas a la vez con la literatura española y con la literatura islámica, y acaso, aún más: constituyen el tercer espacio del encuentro —y del choque— entre ambas. Este libro nos permite el privilegio de escuchar por primera vez la voz, largamente silenciada, de sus autores secretos.

Shards of Love María Rosa Menocal 1994 With the Spanish conquest of Islamic Granada and the expulsion of the Jews from Spain, the year 1492 marks the exile from Europe of crucial strands of medieval culture. It also becomes a symbolic marker for the expulsion of a diversity in language and grammar that was disturbing to the Renaissance sensibility of purity and stability. In rewriting Columbus's narrative of his voyage of that year, Renaissance historians

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rewrote history, as was often their practice, to purge it of an offending vulgarity. The cultural fragments left behind following this exile form the core of Shards of Love, as María Rosa Menocal confronts the difficulty of writing their history. It is in exile that Menocal locates the founding conditions for philology--as a discipline that loves origins--and for the genre of love songs that philology reveres. She crosses the boundaries, both temporal and geographical, of 1492 to recover the "original" medieval culture, with its Mediterranean mix of European, Arabic, and Hebrew poetics. The result is a form of literary history more lyrical than narrative and, Menocal persuasively demonstrates, more appropriate to the Middle Ages than to the revisionary legacy of the Renaissance. In discussions ranging from Eric Clapton's adaption of Nizami's Layla and Majnun, to the uncanny ties between Jim Morrison and Petrarch, Shards of Love deepens our sense of how the Middle Ages is tied to our own age as it expands the

history and meaning of what we call Romance philology.

Culture is an anthology that explores hybridity in

select works from the dawn of Imperial Spain to the twenty-first century. The phenomenon of hybridity has been pervasive throughout Spanish history. The hybrid literary and visual texts studied in this volume—ranging from aljamiado writings and the legacy from the convivencia to contemporary immigration narratives—blur or erase purportedly fixed boundaries: between history and fiction, story and History, nationality and transnationalism, subjectivity and objectivity, as well as between genres, cultures, languages and eras. Hybridity constitutes the state of simultaneously belonging to categories that had previously been considered exclusive. It renders the concept of pure as a construct, a chosen perception, a psychic imposition on experience. Implicit within hybridity is a fusion of two or more separate factors, entities or concepts, but the essential aspect of this fusion is that the hybrid text becomes an original. Hence, hybridity nods to the past, but points to the future. Hybridity in Spanish Culture, written

both in Spanish and English, as a “metahybrid,” is a collection about hybridity that is a hybrid itself. In hopes of blurring borders, dissipating taxonomies, and dehierarchizing binary oppositions, the European and US authors and editors contribute to cultural studies scholarship and underscore the omnipresence and ubiquity of interstitial conditions as they relate to national or cultural identity, linguistic crossings, inter-genre blendings and the conception of home and belonging.

Visions of Deliverance Mayte Green-Mercado 2020-01-15 In *Visions of Deliverance*, Mayte Green-Mercado traces the circulation of Muslim and crypto-Muslim apocalyptic texts known as *joferes* through formal and informal networks of merchants, Sufis, and other channels of diffusion among Muslims and Christians across the

Mediterranean from Constantinople and Venice to Morisco towns in eastern Spain. The movement of these prophecies from the eastern to the western edges of the Mediterranean illuminates strategies of Morisco cultural and political resistance, reconstructing both productive and oppositional interactions and exchanges between Muslims and Christians in the early modern Mediterranean. Challenging a historiography that has primarily understood Morisco apocalyptic thought as the expression of a defeated group that was conscious of the loss of their culture and identity, Green-Mercado depicts Moriscos not simply as helpless victims of Christian oppression but as political actors whose use of end-times discourse helped define and construct their society anew. *Visions of Deliverance* helps us understand the implications of confessionalization, forced conversion, and assimilation in the early modern period and the intellectual and theological networks that shaped politics and identity across

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the Mediterranean in this era.

Tratado Mancebo de Arévalo 2003 La Tafsira del Mancebo de Arévalo es un impresionante texto secreto escrito en aljamiado, es decir, en castellano utilizando los caracteres árabes, que compiló durante la primera mitad del siglo XVI un misterioso morisco que adoptó este seudónimo, guardando así su anonimato. Su obra recoge el saber preservado por los criptomusulmanes moriscos, al tiempo que incorpora el propio acervo cultural del Mancebo, que incluye lecturas de autores griegos, latinos, judíos y cristianos.
